ORDER SCHEDULING HEARINGS AND REQUIRING CUSTOMER NOTICE

BY THE COMMISSION: On August 2, 2013, Aqua North Carolina, Inc. (Applicant or Aqua), filed an application with the Commission seeking authority to increase its rates for providing water and sewer utility service in all of its service areas in North Carolina. The application states Aqua serves approximately 73,578 water customers and 15,010 sewer customers in 52 counties throughout North Carolina.

On August 19, 2013, the Commission issued its Order Establishing General Rate Case and Suspending Rates.

The Commission is of the opinion that the application should be scheduled for hearings and that customers should be notified.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED as follows:

1. That the application is scheduled for an evidentiary hearing as follows:

<u>Raleigh</u>: Beginning at 1:30 p.m., on Monday, January 27, 2014, and continuing as required for testimony and cross-examination of the witnesses of the Applicant, the Public Staff, and any other intervenors, in Commission Hearing Room 2115, Dobbs Building, 430 North Salisbury Street.

2. That the following hearings are scheduled for public witness testimony:

<u>Newton</u>: At 7:00 p.m., on Thursday, November 14, 2013, in the Robert E. Hibbitts Meeting Room, 1924 Courthouse, 30 N. College Avenue;

<u>Raleigh</u>: At 7:00 p.m., on Thursday, November 21, 2013, in Commission Hearing Room 2115, Dobbs Building, 430 North Salisbury Street; <u>Fayetteville</u>: At 7:00 p.m., on Tuesday, December 10, 2013, in the Old Cumberland County Courthouse, Historic Courthouse, Hearing Room # 3, 2^{nd} Floor, 130 Gillespie Street;

<u>Wilmington</u>: At 7:00 p.m., on Thursday, December 12, 2013, in the New Hanover County Courthouse, Courtroom 300, 316 Princess Street;

This requirement shall not apply to events that are neither foreseeable nor within the Applicant's control. This requirement shall not prevent the Applicant from providing evidence showing changes in costs, including plant in service additions, pursuant to G.S. 62-133(c).

5. That the Applicant is required to prefile all testimony on which it will rely at the evidentiary hearing on or before December 13, 2013. The Public Staff shall prefile testimony on or before January 7, 2014, and the Applicant shall prefile any rebuttal testimony no later than January 17, 2014.

6. That petitions to intervene in this proceeding shall be filed pursuant to Commission Rules R1-5 and R1-19 no later than January 7, 2014.

7. That the Applicant is required to file a report addressing all customer service and/or service quality complaints expressed at the hearings held on November 14 and 21, and December 10, 2013, within 20 days after each customer hearing wherein the complaint(s) was/were expressed. The Applicant is required to file a report addressing all customer service and/or service quality complaints expressed at the hearings held on December 12, 16, and 17, 2013, within 15 days after each customer hearing wherein the complaint(s) was/were expressed.

8. That the applicable Notice to Customers, attached as Appendices A, B, and C, shall be mailed with sufficient postage or hand delivered by the Applicant to all customers no later than 15 days after the date of this Order; and the Applicant shall submit to the Commission the attached Certificate of Service properly signed and notarized no later than 30 days after the date of this Order.
