	ORDER GRANTING EXTENSION OF TIME FOR COMPLIANCE FILING

BY THE CHAIRMAN: On June 18, 2014, the Commission issued an Order in the above-captioned docket directing, among other things, that on or before July 1, 2014, Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC (DEC) file a light emitting diode (LED) offering that is available for the replacement of high pressure sodium and metal halide lights, and that DEC share its analysis of such replacements with the North Carolina League of Municipalities (NCLM) in advance of DEC's filing.

On June 26, 2014, DEC and NCLM (Movants) filed a joint motion requesting that the Commission extend the time for DEC to file the LED offering for 90 days, until October 1, 2014. In support of the motion, Movants state that DEC has provided certain baseline transition charge information to NCLM, that DEC and NCLM are collaborating on the development of the transition charge, and that they may be able to reach an agreement on the transition charge. Further, NCLM joins in the motion with the understanding that DEC will continue to respond to NCLM's requests for information, and that DEC will continue to engage in discussions regarding DEC's LED offering.


Based on the Movant's motion and the record, the Chairman finds good cause to extend the time for DEC to file the LED offering to October 1, 2014.
