Dear Mr. Killenberg:

Thank you for your February 25, 2020, letter transmitting additional information for the project noted above. We have reviewed this report and offer the following comments.

Forty-four archaeological sites (31HX545 – 31HX569, 31HX571 – 31HX589) and one historic cemetery (31HX570) are in the project area. We have determined that with the exception of site 31HX581, these resources are either not eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places or have deposits in the project area that do not contribute to their National Register eligibility. While cemetery 31HX570 is not eligible for the National Register, cemeteries are protected under North Carolina General Statutes Chapter 14-148 and 14-149, while cemeteries and burials are afforded consideration under Chapter 65 and 70.

You indicate that no ground-disturbing activities will take place within 50 feet of cemetery 31HX570 and site 31HX581, and that these areas will be marked off with high-visibility fencing during construction. In addition, the submitted project plans show that 31HX570 and 31HX581 will be located outside the security fencing for the solar array, allowing access to cemetery 31HX570 from Neville Farm Road. Based on the information provided, we find that the project as designed will not impact cemetery 31HX570 and will have no effect on any historic properties eligible for listing in the National Register.

The above comments are made pursuant to Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act and the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation's Regulations for Compliance with Section 106 codified at 36 CFR Part 800.
