As part of the largest energy producer and purchaser in the state, we urge the utilities commission to reject Duke Energy and PNG's proposed rate hike. We need to be investing in cleaner, cheaper, renewable energy as a state. Building more stranded assets that rely on fossil fuels will leave some of the poorest places holding the bill.
