N.C. UTILITIES COMMISSION RESCHEDULES HEARINGS DUE TO ADVERSE WEATHER

RALEIGH, N.C. – Due to the forecast of adverse weather affecting the State today and tonight, the North Carolina Utilities Commission is rescheduling hearings previously scheduled to be held in Raleigh for this evening, March 3, 2014, at 7:00 p.m., to receive public testimony on the electric utilities' integrated resource plans in Docket No. E-100, Sub 137, and for Tuesday, March 4, 2014, at 10:00 a.m., to receive public and expert witness testimony in the annual review of gas costs for Frontier Natural Gas Company, LLC, in Docket No. G-40, Sub 119. The hearing in Docket No. G-40, Sub 119 is being rescheduled for Tuesday, March 11, 2014, at 10:00 a.m. No date has yet been set for the hearing in Docket No. E-100, Sub 137.
