BY THE CHAIR: On March 27, 2020, the Commission issued its Order Granting Further Extensions of Time, extending the time for Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC (DEC), and Duke Energy Progress, LLC (DEP), (jointly, Duke) to file on or before April 30, 2020, Duke's queue reform proposal and a redline version of the North Carolina Interconnection Procedures, Forms and Agreements (NC Procedures) conforming to its queue reform proposal. In the Order, the Commission also extended the deadline for comments to May 28, 2020, and the deadline for reply comments to June 25, 2020.

On April 27, 2020, Duke and the North Carolina Clean Energy Business Alliance (NCCEBA) jointly filed a Motion for Further Extension of Time requesting the Commission delay both the filing of Duke's queue reform proposal and the comment period established by the Commission on its proposal. The movants requested the delay to allow NCCEBA further time to review changes to the queue reform proposal, and to allow all parties additional time to reach consensus on the issues.

The movants stated further that they had discussed these issues with the Public Staff, Virginia Electric and Power Company d/b/a Dominion Energy North Carolina, and the North Carolina Sustainable Energy Association, and that each party does not object to the Motion for Further Extensions of Time.

The Chair takes note that the stakeholders involved in the queue reform process have been at work for many months developing, reviewing and discussing proposed revisions to the NC Procedures. In general, the Commission encourages stakeholders to work toward consensus; however, at some point, in the interest of moving forward with queue reform, the stakeholder process must draw to a close and the proposed revisions must be presented to the Commission for resolution. Notwithstanding the foregoing, after consideration of the record and in the interest of achieving consensus, the Chair finds good cause to grant the motion and to extend the time for Duke to file its queue reform proposal and a redline version of the NC Procedures conforming to its queue reform proposal to May 15, 2020. The Chair also finds good cause to extend the time for comments on Duke's proposal to June 15, 2020, and the time for reply comments to July 15, 2020.

IT IS, THEREFORE, SO ORDERED.
