BY THE PRESIDING COMMISSIONER: On August 24, 2021, the Commission issued an Order Scheduling Technical Conference and Denying Motion for Evidentiary Hearing (Technical Conference Order), in the above-captioned docket. The Technical Conference Order, among other things, scheduled an in-person technical conference for September 30 and October 1, 2021, identified three main topics to be discussed, and designated several parties as presenters of information.

- 3. That on or before September 23, 2021, the attorneys for the presenters shall file in this docket all written and audio visual materials to be used by the party's presenters at the technical conference by sending same to ncucexhibits@ncuc.net.
