BY THE PRESIDING COMMISSIONER: On September 14, 2020, the Commission issued an Order Excusing Expert Witnesses, Accepting Testimony and Exhibits, and Canceling Expert Witness Hearing (Hearing Order), in the above-captioned docket involving the application of Duke Energy Progress, LLC (DEP), for recovery of DEP's costs of demand-side management and energy efficiency programs. The Hearing Order, among other things, accepted the parties' expert witness testimony, canceled the expert witness hearing, and required the filing of proposed orders on or before October 16, 2020.

On September 28, 2020, the Public Staff filed a motion requesting that the Commission take judicial notice of Late-Filed Exhibit 2, filed by Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC (DEC), and DEP in Docket Nos. E-7, Sub 1214 and E-2, Sub 1219 on September 3, 2020. In summary, DEC/DEP Late-Filed Exhibit 2 is a statement clarifying whether DEP's Distribution System Demand Response (DSDR), Annual Report filed in June 2020 assumed the conversion of DSDR to a conservation voltage reduction program. The Public Staff stated that DEC/DEP Late-Filed Exhibit 2 is relevant to issues in this proceeding, and that it wishes to reference the document in its proposed order.

On October 6, 2020, DEP filed a letter stating that DEP has no objection to the Public Staff's motion for judicial notice of DEC/DEP Late-Filed Exhibit 2.

Based on the Public Staff's motion and the record, the Presiding Commissioner finds good cause for the Commission to take judicial notice of DEC/DEP Late-Filed Exhibit 2.

IT IS, THEREFORE, SO ORDERED.
