P1. <u>APPLICATIONS FOR CERTIFICATES OF PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND</u> <u>NECESSITY TO CONSTRUCT SOLAR FACILITIES</u>

EXPLANATION: The following applications seeking certificates of public convenience and necessity pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 62-110.1 for construction of solar photovoltaic electric generating facilities were filed pursuant to Commission Rule R8-64.

Duke Energy Progress:

- <u>Docket No. SP-3755, Sub 0</u> Application of Hickory Solar, LLC, for an amended Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to Construct a 5-MW Solar Photovoltaic Facility in Duplin County, North Carolina (registration statement issued previously)
- <u>Docket No. SP-6224, Sub 0</u> Application of Pine Valley Solar Farm, LLC, for an amended Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to Construct a 4.995-MW Solar Photovoltaic Facility in Moore County, North Carolina (registration statement issued previously)
- <u>Docket No. SP-7828, Sub 0</u> Application of Wendell Solar Farm, LLC, for an amended Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to Construct a 5-MW Solar Photovoltaic Facility in Johnston County, North Carolina (registration statement issued previously)
- <u>Docket No. SP-11652, Sub 0</u> Application of Collard Holdings, LLC, for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to Construct an 10-MW Solar Photovoltaic Facility in Scotland County, North Carolina

Dominion Energy North Carolina:

 <u>Docket No. SP-2665, Subs 45 and 46</u> – Application of Fresh Air Energy II, LLC (Applicant), for an amended Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to Construct an 9-MW Solar Photovoltaic Facility in Hertford County, North Carolina and to amend registration. The Applicant further requested that the amended Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity and registration be transferred to Highway-158 PV1, LLC. The Public Staff has reviewed the Applicant's request and recommends that, after the issuance of an Order amending the Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity and registration in Docket No. SP-2665, Sub 45, the Commission transfer the amended certificate and registration to Highway-158 PV1, LLC, in a new docket, cancel the amended certificate and registration in Docket No. SP-2665, Sub 45, and direct the Chief Clerk to close Docket No. SP-2665, Sub 45.

<u>Docket No. SP-6939, Sub 0</u> – Application of Harts Mill Solar, LLC, for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to Construct an 80-MW Solar Photovoltaic Facility in Edgecombe County, North Carolina (no registration statement)

The Public Staff has reviewed the applications and determined that they comply with the requirements of N.C. Gen. Stat. § 62-110.1 and Commission Rule R8-64.

Unless otherwise noted, each applicant has filed a registration statement for a new renewable energy facility. The registration statement includes certified attestations, as required by Commission Rule R8-66(b), that: (1) the facility is in substantial compliance with all federal and state laws, regulations, and rules for the protection of the environment and conservation of natural resources; (2) the facility will be operated as a new renewable energy facility; (3) the applicant will not remarket or otherwise resell any renewable energy certificates sold to an electric power supplier to comply with N.C. Gen. Stat. §. 62-133.8; and (4) the applicant will consent to the auditing of its books and records by the Public Staff insofar as those records relate to transactions with North Carolina electric power suppliers.

RECOMMENDATION: (Saillor/D. Williamson/Lucas/Lawrence) That the Commission issue orders approving the applications and issuing the requested certificates for these facilities. Proposed orders have been provided to the Commission Staff.

The proposed rates would increase the average residential monthly water bill from \$33.60 to \$43.33, a 28.96% increase, based on an average monthly usage of 2,130 gallons.

The Commission is of the opinion that the application constitutes a general rate case, that the proposed new rates should be suspended pending investigation, and that the matter should be scheduled for customer hearing, subject to cancellation if no significant protests are received subsequent to customer notice.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED as follows:

1. That this proceeding is declared a general rate case pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 62-137.

2. That the proposed new rates are suspended for up to 270 days pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 62-134.

3. That the test period is established as the 12-month period ended December 31, 2017.

4. That the application is scheduled for public hearing at 7:00 p.m., on Thursday, April 25, 2019, in Jackson County Court House, Courtroom #2, 401 Grindstaff Road, Sylva, North Carolina 28779. <u>This hearing may be canceled if no significant protests are received subsequent to public notice within 45 days from the date of this notice.</u>

5. That an officer or representative of the Applicant is required to appear in person before the Commission at the time and place of the hearing to testify concerning any of the information contained in the application. If the Applicant desires to cross-examine any witnesses at the hearing, the Applicant shall be represented by legal counsel at this hearing.

6. That the Notice to Customers, attached as Appendix A, be mailed with sufficient postage or hand delivered by the Applicant to all customers affected by the proposed new rates; that the Notice to Customers be mailed or hand delivered no later than 7 days after the date of this Order; and that the Applicant submit to the Commission the attached Certificate of Service properly signed and notarized not later 20 days after the date of this Order.

EFFECT OF RATES

The present rates have been in effect since February 13, 2015. The proposed rates would increase the average residential monthly water bill from \$33.60 to \$43.33, a 28.96% increase, based on an average monthly usage of 2,130 gallons.

PUBLIC HEARING

The Commission has scheduled the application for public hearing at 7:00 p.m., on Thursday, April 25, 2019, in Jackson County Court House, Courtroom #2, 401 Grindstaff Road, Sylva North Carolina 28779. <u>This hearing may be canceled and the matter decided on the filings if no significant protests are received from consumers within 45 days from the date of this notice.</u> Correspondence concerning the proposed rate increase, service problems, or the public hearing should be directed to the Public Staff.

Pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 14-269.4, absent certain specific exceptions, it is unlawful for any person to possess, or carry, whether openly or concealed, any deadly weapon, not used solely for instructional or officially sanctioned ceremonial purposes, in any building housing any court of the General Court of Justice. Therefore, weapons are strictly prohibited at the hearings scheduled in this docket in county courthouses. Everyone entering the county courthouse shall have to pass through a metal detector, and any weapons found will be seized.

The Public Staff is authorized by statute to represent the consumers in proceedings before the Commission. Written statements are not evidence unless those persons submitting the statements appear at a public hearing and testify concerning the information contained in their written statements.
