PUBLIC NOTICE

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the North Carolina Utilities Commission has scheduled a public hearing to be held Thursday, October 14, 2021 at 12:00 p.m. at the Currituck County Courthouse, Courtroom A, 2802 Caratoke Highway, Currituck, North Carolina. The purpose of the hearing is to receive public witness testimony regarding the application of Shawboro East Ridge Solar, LLC (Applicant) for a certificate of public convenience and necessity (CPCN) to construct a 150-MW AC solar photovoltaic (PV) electric generating facility to be located in Currituck County, North Carolina (the Facility). In support of its Application, the Applicant filed the direct testimony of Linda Nwadike. In summary, construction of the 150-MW AC facility is anticipated to begin in the second quarter of 2022 with the expected commercial operation beginning in the fourth quarter of 2022. The Facility is intersected and bound on the east by East Ridge Road, bound on the west by Shawboro and Indiantown Roads in Shawboro, Currituck County, North Carolina. The expected life of the Facility is approximately 40 years. On July 7, 2021, the Public Staff filed a Notice of Completeness stating that the Public Staff has reviewed the application as required by Commission Rule R8-63(d) and that the Public Staff considers the application to be complete. Additional information about the applications is available for review by the public on the Commission's website and online docket system at www.ncuc.net. The Public Staff is authorized by statute to represent consumers in proceedings before the Commission. Written statements to the Public Staff should include any information that the writers wish to be considered by the Public Staff in its investigation of the matter. Such statements should be addressed to Mr. Christopher J. Ayers, Executive Director, Public Staff, 4326 Mail Service Center, Raleigh, North Carolina 27699-4326. The Attorney General is also authorized by statute to represent consumers in proceedings before the Commission. Statements to the Attorney General should be addressed to The Honorable Josh Stein, Attorney General, 9001 Mail Service Center, Raleigh, North Carolina, 27699-9001. Written statements may be emailed to utilityAGO@ncdoj.gov. Written statements will be con-

sidered by the Commission in reaching its decision but do not receive the same consideration as testimony provided by public witnesses at a hearing. Any person desiring to intervene in the proceeding as a formal party of record should file a petition under North Carolina Utilities Commission Rules R1-5 and R1-19 on or before Tuesday, September 21, 2021. Such petitions should be filed with the Chief Clerk of the North Carolina Utilities Commission, 4325 Mail Service Center, Raleigh, North Carolina 27699-4325. The direct testimony and exhibits of expert witnesses to be presented by intervenors should also be filed with the Commission on or before Tuesday, September 21, 2021. The Commission may cancel the public witness hearing if no substantial written complaints regarding the proposed facility are received by the Commission's Chief Clerk on or before Thursday October 7, 2021.
