BY THE PRESIDING COMMISSIONER: On November 23, 2020, the Public Staff filed with the Commission a Motion Requesting that the Commission Take Judicial Notice of Certain Evidence in the Duke Energy Progress, LLC (DEP), Proceeding.

In summary, the Public Staff requests that the Commission take judicial notice of the Corrective Action Plans submitted by DEP to the North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) on December 31, 2019, for the Mayo and Roxboro facilities. The Public Staff argued that the documents are relevant to issues regarding the Company's remediation and closure activities at its coal ash sites and provided web links for the filed plans. The Public Staff further represented that it had consulted with the other parties and – with the exception of the North Carolina Justice Center (NCJC) et al. and Harris Teeter which did not respond – all parties affirmatively stated that they did not object to the motion.

Based on these representations and the records in these dockets, the Presiding Commissioner finds good cause to allow the motion. The Commission takes judicial

notice of the Corrective Action Plans for the Mayo and Roxboro facilities, submitted by DEP to DEQ on December 31, 2019, and linked in the Public Staff's motion.

IT IS, THEREFORE, SO ORDERED.
