BY THE CHAIR: On June 21, 2021, Timbermill Wind, LLC (Timbermill) filed an application in the above-captioned docket to obtain a certificate of environmental compatibility and public convenience and necessity (CECPCN), to construct approximately six miles of 230-kV transmission line in Chowan County, North Carolina, to interconnect a proposed wind energy facility with a planned capacity of up to 189 MW_{AC}. The application for a certificate of public convenience and necessity for construction of the wind energy facility was filed on June 14, 2021, in Docket No, EMP-118, Sub 0.

In summary, Timbermill's application describes the details of the transmission line and the benefits to be provided by the line. Further, the application is supported by pre-filed testimony and describes in detail the preferred route for the transmission line. Finally, as required by N.C. Gen. Stat. § 62-102(c), the application includes a proposed Public Notice that provides a summary of the application.

The Chair is of the opinion that good cause exists to schedule a public witness hearing to consider Timbermill's CECPCN application. Pursuant to N.C.G.S. § 62-104(b), the Commission may cancel the public witness hearing if no significant protests are filed with the Commission. The Chair further concludes that Timbermill should be required to publish the Public Notice attached hereto as Appendix A in the manner required by N.C.G.S. § 62-102(c), and to file an affidavit of publication with the Commission. Finally, the Commission will send the application to the State Clearinghouse for distribution to agencies having an interest in the application.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED as follows:

1. That a public witness hearing shall be held on Thursday, October 14, 2021, at 7:00 p.m., at the Chowan County Courthouse, 101 South Broad Street, Edenton, North Carolina, for the purpose of receiving public witness testimony regarding Timbermill's CECPCN application. *However, the public witness hearing may be cancelled if no significant protests are filed with the Commission subsequent to the publication of Public Notice*;

2. That any person having an interest in this proceeding may file a petition to intervene stating such interest and may file expert witness testimony on or before Wednesday, September 29, 2021;

3. That the Chief Clerk of the Commission shall deliver two copies of the application and the Public Notice attached hereto as Appendix A to the Clearinghouse Coordinator of the Office of Policy and Planning of the Department of Administration for distribution by the Coordinator to State agencies having an interest in the application;

4. That Timbermill shall publish the Public Notice attached hereto as Appendix A in the manner required by N.C.G.S. § 62-102 and Commission Rule R8-62(g) in newspapers having general circulation in Chowan County; and

5. That Timbermill shall file affidavits of publication on or before the date of the public witness hearing.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on June 21, 2021, Timbermill Wind, LLC (Timbermill) filed with the North Carolina Utilities Commission (Commission), an application to obtain a certificate of environmental compatibility and public convenience and necessity (CECPCN), to construct approximately six miles of 230-kV transmission line in Chowan County, North Carolina, to interconnect a proposed wind energy facility with a planned capacity of up to 189 MW_{AC}. The application for a certificate of public convenience and necessity for construction of the wind energy facility was filed on June 14, 2021, in Docket No, EMP-118, Sub 0.

The CECPCN application states that the proposed transmission line route will be sited on private land over which Timbermill and the landowners have executed site control agreements for the purpose of the transmission line. The transmission line will originate at the proposed wind energy facility collector substation south of W. Bear Swamp Road and run approximately six miles south, crossing Paradise Road, to interconnect to the existing 230-kV Winfall-Mackeys transmission line owned by Dominion Energy North Carolina, at a point north of the Norfolk and Southern Railroad and north of U.S. Highway 17 Bypass.
