Hartman to Heart: Feed the Hungry

Isaiah 58:10 instructs us to feed the hungry and help all who are in trouble. Then your light will shine out from the darkness, and the darkness around you will be as bright as noon.

When I think about this verse, I consider that there are all kinds of hunger. Some people are physically hungry, but there is also a spiritual hunger, and physical hunger that does not involve food.

Some people hunger for God's Word. They long for community with other believers to talk about the importance of Scripture and its life-giving application.

There may be others who do not know that it is God's Word for which they hunger, and until someone brings the

Word to them, they will not know it is His Word, which will satisfy their need; this is spiritual hunger. Psalm 34:8 reminds us to taste and see that the LORD is good. Only God can satisfy our spiritual hunger.

One can help meet the need of hunger through volunteering—meeting the needs of children who hunger for love and attention or visiting at a nursing facility, turning loneliness into happiness. These are examples of physical hunger that do not involve food.

Regardless of how one meets a hunger need, it feels good to meet the needs of others. See, God works through our hands when we help others. If we keep our hands, hearts, and lives closed to others, God will not work through us.

Maybe the people who complain that they never witness

God at work in our world, do so because we are falling short of meeting hunger needs. What if we stand before God one day, and He says to us, why did you not show Me through the life I gave you?

When we open our hands, hearts, and lives and work with others and extend opportunities for hunger to be addressed, something beautiful happens, we reflect the light of Christ in this dark world. Isaiah goes on to state, feed the hungry, help those in trouble. Then your light will shine out from the darkness.

Isaiah continues, and the darkness around you will be as bright as noon. There is no arguing that the sun seems to be brightest at noon—because it is during the noon hours that the sun appears to be at the highest place in our sky.

What else does the sun do?

It reflects light on the moon, planets, asteroids, natural satellites, and comets—making them appear to be as bright as the stars. When we meet the needs of others, not only are we bringing the light of hope to the darkness, we reflect the light of Christ in the darkness.

We have this light shining in our hearts, but we ourselves are like fragile clay jars containing this great treasure. Thus, our great power is from God, not from ourselves (2 Corinthians 4:7).

Is there someone in your life to which you can lend a listening ear or a helping hand? Sharing His light is pleasing to God as it glorifies Him.

Meeting another's hunger need is pleasing to God as it also glorifies Him.

I challenge you, feed the hungry, regardless of how that hunger looks.

Whether we like to admit it, we do encounter things counterfeited throughout our lives. The first to come to mind are false friends. You know who they are. They are like a bee on honey to your face yet try to destroy you at your back.

Fake Christians? Of course, the world is filled with them. There is a word from the Vietnam War era that you may have forgotten or maybe even have never heard. Revitalized it was with the public in the movie *Wolf of Wall Street*; Mark Hanna (Matthew McConaughey) explains to Jordan Belford (Leonardo DiCaprio) his thoughts on the forecasting of stock prices. Hanna: "Nobody knows if a stock is gonna go up, down, sideways or in circles. You know what a fugazi is?" Belford: "No — Fugazi. It's a fake..."

The word has shown up in the gangster movie *Donnie Brasco* with Al Pacino. A hot diamond one of the characters wanted to sell

was pronounced a fugazi — a counterfeit. Just so, a Cubic Zirconia is a fugazi diamond. The word is slang, though,

and not considered proper English.

Counterfeit bills flow in and out of our pockets without our even being aware. What about funeral and cemetery fraud. Millions of Americans enter into prearranged contracts to prepay some or all of their burial expenses. My mother was one of those. Dutifully, she paid her monthly remuneration for years.

Near the end of her life, she kept reminding me that I need not worry — her funeral would be paid in full. And, she handed me the document of proof that stayed in a safe and secure place. Upon her death (87 years old), I presented the material to the funeral director. Apologetic as he was, the fact remained the paper was a fugazi, a fake, counterfeit.

The most difficult fugazi to swallow are fake Christian pastors and church leaders. Perhaps

you have encountered a few.

Jesus spoke about these in the parable of the wheat and tares (weeds).

"A man sowed good seeds in his field. But while everyone was sleeping, his enemy came and sowed weeds among the wheat and went away. When the wheat sprouted and formed heads, the weeds also appeared. The owner's servants came to him and said, 'Sir, didn't you sow good seed in your field? Where then did the weeds come from?' 'An enemy did this,' he replied." Matthew 13:24-28 NIV.

The farmer surprised the workers by saying just let the wheat and weeds grow together so as not to upset the roots of the good grain.

American Family Association Supports Pastor's Lawsuit

TUPELO, Miss. — A Virginia pastor who until last week was facing jail time and a \$2,500 fine for holding services during the coronavirus pandemic is suing the state for violating his religious liberty, drawing support from the American Family Association (AFA, www.afa.net).

Kevin Wilson, pastor of Lighthouse Fellowship Church, defied Gov. Ralph Northam's order to limit religious gatherings to 10 people by allowing 16 worshippers into his 293-seat sanctuary on April 5.

Officers interrupted the worship service to issue a summons that threatened a fine and incarceration.

AFA — along with the U.S. Justice Department and Vice President Mike Pence — has expressed support for Wilson's religious liberty suit against Virginia.

AFA Executive Vice President Ed Vitagliano says the abuse of power suffered by Wilson and his congregation reflects a deep-seated prejudice against Christianity in American culture.

"While the vast majority of Americans have been struggling to cope with the challenges presented by Covid-19, something else has become very clear: the latent hostility of the secularist left," Vitagliano said.

"The virulent anti-Christian bigotry in our nation has been eye-opening. For police in Virginia to rush into a church and charge a pastor with a crime for holding a worship service makes it stunningly clear that the God-haters were merely waiting for their chance to pounce.

"Those with a mind to preserve religious liberty in America, prepare to defend yourselves."

During the period in which Wilson was served the summons, Northam was encouraging mass protests and holding press conferences that did not abide by a 10-person limit, according to Mat Staver, Wilson's lawyer and the founder of Liberty Counsel.

The Department of Justice submitted a statement of interest in support of Lighthouse Fellowship Church on May 3.

"This case raises issues of national public importance regarding the interplay between the government's compelling interest in protecting public health and safety from COVID-19 and citizens' fundamental right to the free exercise of religion," the DOJ statement asserted. "There is no pandemic exception to the Constitution and its Bill of Rights."

The charges against Wilson were dropped on July 10.

people apart as they traveled through the schools.

Dear PQ School Family,

Over the weekend the school system was notified that a student who attends Perquimans Central School has tested positive for the Coronavirus. To protect the student's privacy, just as we would any student and family, we will not release the student's name, grade level or teacher's name.

We are working closely with Albemarle Regional Health Services as they follow the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services (NC DHSS) guidelines on contact tracing of individuals who may have had close contact. Close contacts are defined as having direct contact with, or being within 6 feet for at least 15 minutes, of a case-patient while not wearing recommended personal protective equipment.

The student is currently isolating at home. The family has done an excellent job of supporting mitigating efforts outlined

in the school system's re-entry plan by following the daily screening process and keeping the child at home when symptoms emerged. As a reminder, parents are asked to conduct daily screenings of their child's overall well-being. Parents know their children best. You should keep your child at home if your child is experiencing fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, or diarrhea. The school district will continue to conduct daily screenings of all students, require face coverings and social distancing in classrooms and in other areas throughout the school. We will continue to sanitize and disinfect classrooms and high touch areas daily.

Perquimans County Schools and ARHS have joined together with school districts region wide to coordinate efforts and best practices to ensure consistency and communication throughout these unprecedented times. By working

together, we will follow the data, along with state and federal guidance, to ensure we are making the best decisions possible for our communities.

We will strive to find that balance of normalcy and safety to the best of our ability. Unfortunately, as we have all seen with the recent rise in lab confirmed cases throughout our region and North Carolina, we know we will see COVID-19 cases. What is most important is how we all work together to mitigate that impact and strive to keep our communities as healthy and safe as possible, and as you know, that lies not only in what we do as a school system and health district, but also in what we do as individual citizens, following the necessary precautions to keep each other safe.

In an effort to outline what to expect over the coming school year, we will work to provide updates and additional information on the public health response. Perquimans County Schools and ARHS will work closely together once a teacher, staff or student tests positive for COVID-19. Our

aim is to provide transparent communication, while protecting privacy, in order to maintain trust with the communities we passionately serve. As we are made aware of confirmed cases, PQ Schools will follow the lead of our health partners, who will initiate communication with individuals as necessary.

ARHS has and will continue to follow the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services (NC DHSS) guidelines on contact tracing of all individuals who may have had close contact with a positive case. Close contacts are defined as having direct contact with, or being within 6 feet for at least 15 minutes, of a case-patient while not wearing recommended personal protective equipment.

■ When contacts are identified, ARHS works with the patient and will also work with the school system to ensure that all contacts are properly notified in a timely manner.

ARHS and PQ Schools will

adhere to the following steps:

■ Local health department staff will contact the case-patient and determine all the people the case-patient has been in close contact with during their period of infectivity. Close contacts are defined as having direct contact with, or being within 6 feet for at least 15 minutes, of a case-patient while not wearing recommended personal protective equipment. Caregivers and household members of the case-patient are considered close contacts.

■ Only close contacts who had contact with the case-patient during the period of infectivity (defined as the date the case-patient developed symptoms up to the time the case-patient went into isolation) are notified.

■ Contacts are notified of close exposure and asked to self-monitor for an increased temperature and respiratory symptoms.

■ Health department staff will instruct the contact to monitor for symptoms twice a day (morning and evening) for 14 days from the date of last contact with the case-patient or for 14 days

after the case-patient's isolation ends if in continued contact throughout their illness (i.e., household members of the patient, fellow residents of congregating facilities, etc.)

■ Symptom monitoring should be conducted from the date of each person's first contact with the case-patient continuing through 14 days after their last contact with the case-patient or for 14 days after the case-patient's isolation ends if in continued contact throughout their illness.

We understand the importance of providing our community public health information, while maintaining confidentiality in accordance with FERPA, NCGS § 130A-143, and all other state and federal laws. We look forward to working together with you, to best serve our children's health and education.

strategies to address all types of learners."

Garvey believes that every child deserves an education that meets his or her needs.

NC court pulls man off death row

RALEIGH — The North Carolina Supreme Court on Friday vacated the death sentence of Marcus Raymond Robinson of Fayetteville, who in 2012 was the first of four people to use the state's controversial Racial Justice Act to be removed from death row.

Robinson is in prison for the murder and robbery of 17-year-old Erik Tornblom in Fayetteville in 1991. The Racial Justice Act of 2009 allowed death row

inmates to petition the courts to review whether racial bias in the criminal justice system influenced their trials and the jury decisions to sentence them to death.

It was lauded by some for its effort to address decades of systemic racism in the criminal justice system. Critics contended it was not about race but instead part of a long-term effort to

abolish the death penalty. Robinson and three other defendants used the Racial Justice Act in 2011 and 2012 to persuade Cumberland County Superior Court Judge Greg Weeks that the prosecutors in their murder trials were racially biased in their selection of jurors — that they used their power to strike potential jurors to keep Blacks off the jury under a premise that a Black person would be less likely to convict or vote for a death sentence. Weeks in 2012 re-sentenced Robinson and the

other three defendants from Fayetteville-area homicides to life in prison without parole, and they were removed from death row.

The legislature, citing these cases, repealed the Racial Justice Act in 2013, but the four remained off death row until the Supreme Court in late 2015 ruled that Weeks made errors at the Racial Justice Act hearings in 2011 and 2012 and the cases need to be done over. The defendants were returned to death row.

In 2017, Superior Court

Judge W. Edwin Spainhour said the defendants could no longer use the Racial Justice Act because it had been repealed.

Friday's 4-3 ruling, with the majority opinion written by Chief Justice Cheri Beasley, overturns Spainhour.

Beasley said Robinson's constitutional right against double jeopardy was violated when his death sentence was re-imposed in 2016. Once a death penalty is canceled, she said, court precedents say it cannot be put back on

a defendant.

She said Robinson's sentence should be life in prison without parole as specified when the Racial Justice Act was enacted in 2009.

Friday's decision could allow the other three Racial Justice Act defendants to also come off death row, said Associate Justice Paul Newby in a pointed dissent.

Newby contends that Beasley misapplied precedent and law in her arguments that double jeopardy applied to Robinson's death sentence.

Black Portland reflects on role of white allies in movement

PORTLAND, Ore. — More than two months of intense protests in Portland, Oregon — one of America's whitest major cities — have captured the world's attention and put a place that's less than 6% Black at the heart of the conversation about police brutality and systemic racism.

Since May, nightly demonstrations in Oregon's largest city have featured overwhelmingly white crowds — from middle-aged mothers marching arm in arm to the mayor getting tear-gassed by federal agents to teenagers dressed in black smashing police precinct windows and tossing fireworks at authorities.

The weeks of often chaotic protests have transformed the Black Lives Matter movement into a microcosm of the national debate on race and police brutality. It's also prompted introspection in the liberal city's small Black community about the role of white demonstrators in the Black Lives Matter movement and what it means to be a white ally in this transformational moment.

The violence and vandalism that have marked the protests, often done by white people, have divided the Black community, along with a debate over what's next. Some want to keep marching, while others want to use the momentum to work with elected officials on cementing long-term change.

"It's a perfect storm with everything that's been happening, and add to that the attention of the world being on Portland, Oregon, right now — we have a unique space," said Sam Thompson, who founded the group Black Men and Women United last month to push the movement

toward long-term Black resilience.

"If those people weren't there and they weren't protesting to the level they are now, we wouldn't be having this conversation 2 1/2 months later," he said. As white people see the protests, "when the person that looks like you is breaking the windows and starting the fires, you deal with that a lot differently than when it's someone who doesn't look like you."

Portland's movement has carried a current of tension as the Black community and white protesters navigate a complex racial calculus: In such a white city, how can white residents support Black rights without making themselves the story?

That's a delicate question in a progressive city with a deeply racist past. Portland, a focal point of the Black Lives Matter movement in part because of its bastion of white supporters, is so lacking in diversity because of centuries of laws that excluded and marginalized Black people.

Early "exclusion laws" prohibited Black people from settling in Oregon, and by the 1920s, Portland was known as one of the most segregated cities north of the Mason-Dixon line and a hotbed for the Ku Klux Klan. Later, real estate laws and city planning effectively crammed Black families in a few pockets of Portland. Today's soaring real estate prices have scattered those Black homeowners to the fringes of the city and beyond.

"We do not have an area that's ours, and that was intentional," Thompson said. "These are the things we're trying to work through."

Because of that history, some Black people have felt a cognitive dissonance when they see the crowds of white supporters, many of them arriving

from homes in neighborhoods that were once Black havens.

"We live in a state that was designed to be a white utopia, and it is truly something remarkable for Portland currently to be at the center of the nation's attention for Black Lives Matter," said Cameron Whitten, founder of the Black Resilience Fund, which has raised \$1.5 million this summer to invest in the Black community. "I could disagree with how they're doing it, but in the end, they're putting their bodies on the line to protect me — and that is huge compared to what we're used to."

While many Black residents have embraced that enthusiasm, the white crowds make retaining ownership of the movement critical. That's led to disagreements in the Black community about what it means to be a white ally.

Some, including the former leader of the Black United Front and the head of the local NAACP chapter, have criticized white protesters who vandalize police precincts amid their call to defund police. Some Black leaders also held a news conference with Mayor Ted Wheeler — the wealthy white scion of a timber family — to say violence is distracting from the Black Lives Matter message.

Those appeals from

an organization pushing to defund police.

"That is outrageous, and it's happening in 2020. That's incredible that that would happen, and the world would view that and talk about the damage on the sidewalk or on a building," she said.

Raiford was among those who grew alarmed when the telegenic Wall of Moms, a group of middle-aged, mostly white women, rocketed to national attention as they marched arm in arm at the nightly protests. Media flocked to their story, but the group imploded within days over accusations that their white founder wanted to monetize the group and weaponize it against President Donald Trump.

A smaller number of the self-described moms still protest, joining Black mothers under the group Moms United for Black Lives. They are led each night by Demetria Hester, a Black activist who was attacked three years ago by

a white supremacist, which some believe set the stage for the city's current racial reckoning.

Hester, who was arrested this week while protesting, said the white moms have impressed her with their commitment to "getting woke" — educating themselves about Portland's racist history and the extent of their privilege as white Americans.

"They're working hard to educate themselves and educate other people and help the Black community. Our moms are wonderful for even acknowledging the fact that they have white privilege and the system needs to change," she said after prosecutors dismissed her charges.

"They've been arrested, they've been tear-gassed, they've been hit with rubber bullets," she said of the white moms. "They're going through just like what we're going through — and that opens their eyes to a whole other level of understanding."

Trump makes call for new WH doctor's virus advice

WASHINGTON — President Donald Trump has found a new doctor for his coronavirus task force — and this time there's no daylight between them.

Trump last week announced that Dr. Scott Atlas, a frequent guest on Fox News Channel, has joined the White House as a pandemic adviser. Atlas, the former chief of neurology at Stanford University Medical Center and a fellow at Stanford's conservative Hoover Institution, has no expertise in public health or infectious diseases.

But he has long been a critic of coronavirus lockdowns and has campaigned for kids to return to the classroom and for the return of college sports, just like Trump.

"Scott is a very famous man who's also very highly respected," Trump told reporters as he introduced the addition. "He has many great ideas and he thinks what we've done is really good."

Atlas' hiring comes amid ongoing tensions between the president and Dr. Anthony Fauci, the nation's top infectious diseases expert, and Deborah Birx, the task force's coordinator. While Birx remains closely involved in the administration's pandemic response, both she and Fauci have publicly contradicted the rosy picture the president has painted of a virus that has now killed more than 167,000 people in the United States and infected millions nationwide.

Atlas, the sole doctor to share the stage at Trump's pandemic briefings this past week, has long

questioned policies that have been embraced by public health experts both in the U.S. and abroad. He has called it a "good thing" for younger, healthy people to be exposed to the virus, while falsely claiming children are at near "zero risk."

In an April op-ed in The Hill newspaper, Atlas bemoaned that lockdowns may have prevented the development of "natural herd immunity."

"In the absence of immunization, society needs

circulation of the virus, assuming high-risk people can be isolated," he wrote. In television appearances, Atlas has called on the nation to "get a grip" and argued that "there's nothing wrong" with having low-risk people get infected, as long as the vulnerable are protected.

Riot declared outside Portland public safety building

PORTLAND, Ore. — Police forced protesters away from a law enforcement building in Oregon's biggest city early Sunday, as efforts to stop the demonstrators from gathering at the building seemingly fell apart.

The protesters apparently had plans Saturday night to march from a park to the Penumbra Kelly public safety building, news outlets reported. But, a standoff between marchers and officers took place on a bridge along the way — and the demonstrators retreated.

Protesters appear to have returned to the park, and then taken cars to the building, according to a reporter for The Oregonian/Oregon Live.

Police initially declared an unlawful assembly, saying items had been thrown at officers, green lasers had been pointed at them and paintballs had been fired. The gathering was later declared a riot. Officers had

been hit with rocks, bottles and other objects, police said.

Images posted online showed officers using smoke to clear the area. Several people were seen being detained, but it's unclear whether any arrests were made.

Similar protests have previously occurred at the Penumbra Kelly building, including last weekend.

The unrest followed rivaling protests Saturday afternoon. Federal authorities forced demonstrators away from a plaza near a federal building as dueling demonstrations by right-wing and left-wing protesters turned violent.

The area includes county and federal buildings and has been the site of numerous recent protests. Department of Homeland Security officers moved through the plaza across from an 18-story federal building. A federal courthouse is also near that area.

Violent demonstrations have gripped Portland for months, following the police killing of George Floyd in Minneapolis police custody.

The Saturday afternoon demonstration involving hundreds of people began about noon near the Multnomah County Justice Center, news outlets reported. Demonstrators hurled rocks and other items at each other and got into fights. Streets were blocked amid the mayhem.

Right-wing groups had announced a rally near the Justice Center Saturday afternoon that quickly drew counterdemonstrators.

No arrests were reported. In a statement, Portland Police said there had been questions about why the afternoon gathering wasn't declared a riot and why city police officers didn't intervene. Incident commanders have to determine whether police action will make things more dangerous, the statement said.

Winds could fan already enormous Northern Calif. fires

SAN FRANCISCO — A calm overnight allowed firefighters to make progress against a trio of massive wildfires burning in Northern California but they were girding for a weather system Sunday that will bring high winds and thunderstorms that could spark new fires and fan existing blazes that destroyed nearly 1,000 homes and other structures and forced tens of thousands to evacuate.

The "complexes," or groups of fires, burning on all sides of the San Francisco Bay Area were started by lightning strikes that were among 12,000 registered in the state in the past week. The National Weather Service issued a "red flag" warning through Monday afternoon for the drought-stricken area, meaning extreme fire conditions including high temperatures, low humidity and wind gusts up to 65 mph (105 kph) that "may result in dangerous and unpredictable fire behavior."

At a morning briefing on the so-called CZU Lightning Complex fire in the Santa Cruz Mountains south of San Francisco, fire officials said they had increased containment to 8% and with the better weather on Saturday dug more protective fire lines around vulnerable communities, including the University of California, Santa Cruz.

But there is concern about the weather and the thunderstorms that will bring high winds and "dry" lightning, a term used when such storms

have little or no rain. Radar images from late morning showed lightning offshore and approaching the coast.

Chief Mark Brunton, a battalion chief for the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (Cal Fire), said the winds can blow a fire in any direction and while he's confident firefighters did the most with the time they had to prepare, he's not sure what to expect.

"There's a lot of potential for things to really go crazy out there," he said.

Another challenge for firefighters and police are people who refuse to leave the evacuation zone out of stubbornness or because they want to protect their homes and others who use the chaos to commit crimes. Brunton said he was "sickened" to learn that a fire commander was robbed while helping coordinate efforts on Saturday. Someone entered the commander's fire vehicle and stole personal items, including a wallet and "drained his bank account."

Santa Cruz Sheriff's Department Chief Deputy Chris Clark said when

people don't heed evacuation orders it makes it harder for firefighters to do their job and for police to protect property. It's also inherently dangerous for civilians, with fires burning unpredictably and tree branches falling -- one hit a patrol car and damaged the windshield.

"Please, please, please leave the evacuation area," he said.

Since Aug. 15, state fire officials said more than 500 fires of varying sizes have burned throughout California, scorching a million acres, or 1,562 square miles (4,046 square kilometers). Of those, about two dozen major fires were attracting much of the state's resources.

Most of the damage was caused by the three complexes that were ravaging forest and rural areas in and around the San Francisco Bay Area. They have burned 1,175 square miles (3,043 square kilometers), destroyed almost 1,000 homes and other structures and killed five people, three of them who were found in a home in an area under an evacuation order.

Marco becomes hurricane headed for US Gulf Coast

PORT-AU-PRINCE, Haiti — Marco became a hurricane over the Gulf of Mexico Sunday on a path toward the Louisiana coast as Tropical Storm Laura killed at least seven people in the Dominican Republic and Haiti.

Laura was headed over Cuba before its path likely took it to the same part of the U.S. coast, also as a potential hurricane. It would be the first time two hurricanes form in the Gulf of Mexico simultaneously, according to records dating to at least 1900, said Colorado State University hurricane researcher Phil Klotzbach.

The National Hurricane Center said Marco was about 300 miles (480 kilometers) south of the mouth of the Mississippi River and heading north-northwest at 14 miles per hour (22 kph), packing winds of 75 miles per hour (120 kph). The center warned of life-threatening storm surges and hurricane-force winds along the Gulf Coast.

Haitian civil protection officials said they had received reports that a 10-year-old girl had died when a tree fell on a home in the southern coastal town of Anse-a-Pitres, on the border with the Dominican Republic. Haitian President Jovenel Moïse said at least four other people had died during the storm, and in the Dominican Republic, relatives told reporters that a mother and her young son had died after a wall collapsed on them.

Hundreds of thousands were without power in the Dominican Republic, as both countries on the island of Hispaniola suffered heavy flooding.

A hurricane watch was issued for the New Orleans metro area, which Hurricane Katrina pummeled in August 2005.

Laura was centered about 55 miles (90 kilometers) off the eastern tip of Cuba Sunday, with maximum sustained winds of 50 mph (80 kph). It was moving west-northwest at 11 mph (18 kph).

Crews armed with megaphones in the Dominican capital of Santo Domingo had urged dozens of residents in flood-prone areas to evacuate before Laura's heavy rains hit. The storm left more than 100,000 people without water in the Dominican Republic on Saturday night, while earlier it snapped trees and knocked out power to more than 200,000 customers in neighboring Puerto Rico.

It was forecast to move over Cuba on Sunday night or Monday. Officials in the Florida Keys, which Laura might pass over on its route into the Gulf, declared a local state of emergency and issued a mandatory evacuation order for anyone living on boats, in mobile homes and in campers. Tourists staying in hotels were warned to be aware

of hazardous weather conditions and consider changing their plans starting Sunday.

New warnings were added Sunday morning — including a storm surge warning from Morgan City, Louisiana to Ocean Springs, Mississippi, and a hurricane warning from Morgan City to the mouth of the Pearl River. A tropical storm warning included Lake Pontchartrain in Louisiana, and metropolitan New Orleans.

A storm surge of up to 6 feet (2 meters) was forecast for parts of coastal Louisiana and Mississippi.

Louisiana Gov. John Bel Edwards, who declared a state of emergency Friday, asked President Donald Trump for a federal emergency declaration.

People in Louisiana headed to stores to stock up on food, water and other supplies.

Both storms were expected to bring 3 to 6 inches (8 to 15 centimeters) of rain to areas they were passing over or near, threatening flooding.

The hurricane center said the storms were not expected to interact as the region faces an unusually active hurricane season.

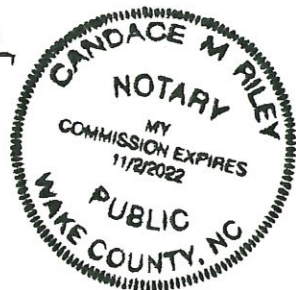



Man unhurt when SUV catches fire

A Wilson County man was uninjured Friday when his SUV burst into flames.

Tyler Sutton of Grimsley Store Road between Wilson and Stantonburg was coming home around 11:40 a.m. when his 2007 Chevrolet Trailblazer SS caught fire.

"I was coming up (N.C.) 58 coming to my house and I started to notice it was acting funny. It started flaming up in flames and I got out as fast as I could."

Sutton felt fortunate to walk away from the burning vehicle.

"It was flaming up all under the steering wheel," he said. "Luckily I didn't get hurt. Luckily

I didn't have my two-week-old baby with me."

Firefighter and first responder Chris Black of the Stantonburg-Moyton Volunteer Fire Department said the Sanoca and East Nash volunteer fire departments joined Stantonburg-Moyton in the response.

"We got the fire knocked out," Black said. "Everybody's going home safe. Nobody was hurt. All in all, everybody did a strong job."

Six firefighters from the three departments helped with the fire, spraying the vehicle with foam and water.

"We use the foam to smother out the heat and to smother out flame. It works really good," Black said. "It suffocates it. It's kind of like putting a blanket over a fire. Essentially, this is just a wet blanket."

Black said the fire didn't threaten a nearby home.

"The fire itself was a pretty good ways away from the structure," Black said. "Usually when somebody calls in a car fire, the first thing they ask is 'Is it near a house?' and if they say 'Yes, it's near a house,' then typically it is automatically endangering a structure."

Black said the firefighters worked well together.

"We couldn't ask for a better team. Couldn't ask for better mutual aid," Black said. "Everybody did a great job today. Strong work all around. We're good to have them and happy we've got them."

Sutton's vehicle was destroyed.

"I've got a lot of money tied up into the truck," Sutton said. "I just don't know what to say now. I'm heartbroken."







Baby squirrels and other wildlife often get separated from their family or fall from nests. Help is available from the North Carolina Wildlife Commission.

Wildlife Commission provides tips for helping 'orphaned' young squirrels

The second half of summer comes with a few typical themes: the sound of lawnmowers, outdoor walks and young squirrels falling out of trees.

Yes, that's right. This is the time of year, especially with recent storms and heavy rains, that squirrels such as the common gray squirrel are raising their second brood of the year.

Summer storms and tree-cutting activity, along with other similar events, can lead to young squirrels, and sometimes the whole leafy nest, falling out of their high tree perches.

As a result, biologists with the N.C. Wildlife Resources Commission see an influx of reports from concerned citizens who have found a groundling young squirrel and want to know how to help.

The first thing to do is look to see if the animal is obviously injured, wet or otherwise sickly-looking. If not, it's probably safe to leave it where you found it long enough to contact a professional and get his/her advice.

Licensed wildlife rehabilitators in North Carolina specialize in caring for injured or orphaned wildlife and can help people take the right action to give the animal its best chance of survival. More often than not, they'll recommend leaving the young squirrel there to give the mother a chance to retrieve it.

When a squirrel's nest is disturbed and the young end up on the ground, the female will work as fast as she can to find her young and place them back in the nest. If the nest is destroyed, she'll build a new nest first, then search for each of her young and carry them to the new nest.

If a young squirrel is removed from the area before the female retrieves it, the chances of its surviving are significantly reduced.

"Humans simply are not as good at taking care of young animals as their mothers," said Fahn Owens, the Commission's extension biologist. "I cannot overemphasize how important it is to speak with a licensed wildlife rehabilitator first, before taking a wild animal home and attempting to care for it."

Although people may mean well, handling a wild animal, and particularly a young one, can cause more harm than good. This is especially true if the female comes looking for her young and can't find them.

Licensed wildlife rehabilitators can provide advice on whether or not the animal actually needs human help, and what type of help to provide. For example, while giving a young animal food or water is often a person's first instinct, it is not recommended, and can be quite harmful. If needed, wildlife rehabilitators are legally able to take the animal in and care for it until it can be released back into the wild.

Despite a person's best intentions, a wild animal is best left where it was found, or in the hands of a licensed wildlife rehabilitator. During the busy season for orphaned and injured wildlife concerns, wildlife rehabilitators can be very busy. If they don't answer the phone right away, Owens advises to leave them a message rather than calling multiple times. When in doubt, even a rehabilitator in another county can provide advice over the phone.
