BY THE COMMISSION: On March 8, 2019, the Commission issued a Scheduling Order in the above-captioned docket that, among other things, scheduled the hearing in this matter for Tuesday, June 4, 2019, set dates for interventions and the filing of testimony, and required Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC (DEC) to publish notice of the proceeding. - 2. That any person having an interest in this proceeding may file a petition to intervene stating such interest on or before Monday, May 20, 2019;
- 3. That the direct testimony and exhibits of the Public Staff and other intervenors shall be filed on or before Monday, May 20, 2019;
- 4. That DEC may file rebuttal testimony and exhibits no later than Thursday, May 30, 2019;
- 5. That DEC shall publish the Public Notice attached hereto as Appendix A in a newspaper or newspapers having general circulation in its service area once a week for two successive weeks beginning at least 45 days prior to the hearing;

- 6. That DEC shall file affidavits of publication on or before the date of the hearing; and
- 7. That the parties shall comply with the discovery guidelines established in the Commission's previous Scheduling Order.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the North Carolina Utilities Commission has scheduled a public hearing in the annual Renewable Energy and Energy Efficiency Portfolio Standard (REPS) cost recovery application and compliance report filed on February 26, 2019, by Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC (DEC), in the above-captioned docket. The public hearing has been scheduled to begin immediately following the hearings in Docket Nos. E-7, Subs 1190 and 1192, which are scheduled to begin at 9:30 a.m., on Tuesday, June 11, 2019, in Commission Hearing Room 2115, Dobbs Building, 430 North Salisbury Street, Raleigh, North Carolina. This proceeding is being held pursuant to N.C.G.S. § 62-133.8 and Commission Rule R8-67 to consider DEC's application for approval of REPS cost recovery and compliance with the REPS requirements during the 2018 calendar year. Public witness testimony will be received in accordance with Commission Rule R1-21(g).

On February 26, 2019, DEC filed direct testimony and exhibits in support of its application for REPS cost recovery and 2018 REPS compliance report. By its application, DEC proposes to implement the following monthly REPS rates, not including regulatory fee, effective for service rendered on and after September 1, 2019: a \$0.87 charge for residential customers; a \$4.64 charge for general service and lighting customers; and a \$21.28 charge for industrial customers. DEC's proposed new monthly REPS rates, if approved, will result in the following increases to DEC's current monthly REPS rates, not including regulatory fee: \$0.80 for residential customers; \$3.61 for general service and lighting customers; and \$27.71 for industrial customers.

Specific information about DEC's application for approval of REPS cost recovery and 2018 REPS compliance report may be obtained from the Office of the Chief Clerk, North Carolina Utilities Commission, Raleigh, North Carolina, where a copy of DEC's REPS cost recovery application and 2018 compliance report are available for review by the public, and on the Commission's website at www.ncuc.net.

The Public Staff is authorized by statute to represent consumers in proceedings before the Commission. Written statements to the Public Staff should include any

information that the writers wish to be considered by the Public Staff in its investigation of the matter. Such statements should be addressed to Mr. Christopher J. Ayers, Executive Director, Public Staff, 4326 Mail Service Center, Raleigh, North Carolina 27699-4300.

The Attorney General is also authorized by statute to represent consumers in proceedings before the Commission. Written statements are not evidence unless persons appear at a public hearing and testify concerning the information contained in their written statements.

Any person desiring to intervene in the proceeding as a formal party of record should file a petition under North Carolina Utilities Commission Rules R1-5 and R1-19 on or before Monday, May 20, 2019. Such petitions should be filed with the Chief Clerk of the North Carolina Utilities Commission, 4325 Mail Service Center, Raleigh, North Carolina 27699-4300. The direct testimony and exhibits of expert witnesses to be presented by intervenors should also be filed with the Commission on or before Monday, May 20, 2019.
