BY THE CHAIR: On September 23, 2020, the Commission issued a Notice of Due Date for Proposed Orders and Briefs (Notice), in the above-captioned dockets. The Notice informed the parties that the transcript of testimony had been made available, and that briefs and proposed orders are to be filed on or before October 26, 2020.

On October 5, 2020, the Public Staff filed a motion requesting that the Commission extend the date for filing briefs and proposed orders to November 2, 2020. In summary, the Public Staff stated that it is working with Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC (DEC), on a joint proposed order relating to the matters that are the subject of the two settlements between the Public Staff and DEC. Further, the Public Staff stated that it is engaged in several other proceedings pending before the Commission, including the general rate case application of Duke Energy Progress, LLC, in Docket No. E-2, Sub 1219. In addition, the Public Staff stated that it contacted all parties about its motion, and that DEC, Sierra Club, Carolina Industrial Group for Fair Utility Rates III, North Carolina Justice Center,

North Carolina Housing Coalition, Natural Resources Defense Council, North Carolina League of Municipalities, Appalachian Voices, Center for Biological Diversity, Tech Customers, NC WARN, North Carolina Sustainable Energy Association, Carolina Utility Customers Association, Inc., Office of the North Carolina Attorney General, Harris Teeter, and Vote Solar consent to the extension requested, that Commercial Group does not take a position, and that North Carolina Clean Energy Business Alliance has not responded.

Based on the Public Staff's motion and the record, the Chair finds good cause to extend the date for parties to file briefs and proposed orders to November 2, 2020.

IT IS, THEREFORE, SO ORDERED.
