Dear Mr. Stein,

As a North Carolina home owner, I am writing to express my concerns regarding the 15% water and sewer rate increase requested by Carolina Water Service (CWS). This is the 5th rate increase requested in the last seven years and rates in the area have increased nearly 120% since 2004. In 2017, just last year, CWS received a 16% increase in their rates.

My wife and I believe in the conservation of natural resources and often use minimal water month to month. CWS currently has the right to charge us for water treatment even when we have no water use or consumption for the month. So despite our efforts and our limited water consumption and treatment our bills are always in the \$140+ range per month, even when we use no water for the entire billing cycle. So CWS makes their money no matter what our consumption is each month. (The water usage cost is usually under \$20 per month in a typical bill).

These rate increases are untenable for many citizens in this area. With salaries mostly flat for the last decade or so, it isn't fair to the citizenry to be burdened with water bills that have risen with such alarming regularity and at such high percentages.

We hope the needs of the people are prioritized over the profits of the utility.
