BY THE CHAIRMAN: On February 1, 2019, in the above-captioned proceedings, the Commission issued an Order Modifying and Approving the Green Source Advantage (GSA) Program established pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 62-159.2. Pursuant to that Order, Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC and Duke Energy Progress, LLC (together, Duke) were required to make a compliance filing consisting of revised rider leaflets, GSA Service Agreements, GSA Program power purchase agreements (PPAs), and any other documents that Duke proposes to use in the administration of the GSA Program. In addition, the Commission allowed Duke to include in that filing a narrative explanation of the revisions made to the GSA Program to aid the Commission and the parties to this proceeding in determining whether the revised program complies with the requirements of this Order and to identify any additional issues that arise in the required restructuring of the Program

On March 18, 2019, Duke made its required compliance filing.

On May 1, 2019, the North Carolina Clean Energy Business Alliance (NCCEBA) filed a motion pursuant to N.C.G.S. § 62-80 requesting that the Commission reconsider one of the determinations made in the February 1 Order related to Duke's participation in the GSA Program. As is more specifically described in its motion, NCCEBA argues that the Commission's determination that allows Duke to receive cost-of-service based recovery after the term of a GSA Service Agreement between Duke and a GSA participating customer was based upon a misapprehension of information regarding the context and consequences of that decision.

On May 6, 2019, the Commission issued an Order requesting that the parties herein file comments in the above-captioned dockets regarding NCCEBA's motion on or before May 13, 2019, and that NCCEBA file reply comments on or before May 20, 2019.

On May 9, 2019, Duke filed a motion for extension of time requesting that the Commission allow all parties until May 20, 2019, to file comments and to similarly allow NCCEBA until May 27, 2019, to file its reply comments. In support of its motion, Duke

states that it is diligently working to prepare its comments, but, due to significant time commitments to other matters pending before the Commission, Duke is in need of additional time to file its comments. In addition, Duke states that it contacted counsel for NCCEBA and the Public Staff and that these parties have agreed to the requested extensions.

The Chairman finds good cause to grant Duke's motion, allowing all parties until May 20, 2019, to file comments on NCCEBA's motion, and similarly allowing NCCEBA until May 27, 2019, to file its reply comments.

IT IS, THEREFORE, SO ORDERED.
