Subject: Re: Implementation of Aqua order

To clarify:

The Attorney General's Office supports the return of excess deferred income taxes using a flat amount per month (that lowers the fixed monthly charge) rather than a percentage reduction (that is similar to the design used for recovery of the WISC charge) for the following reasons:

- fixed monthly charges encourage conservation and give consumers more control over their bills since lower usage has a bigger impact on the total bill
- •lower fixed monthly charges tend to be less burdensome for low income and elderly consumers.

As we know, the Order came out last week and there are some brisk timetables that Aqua should observe to give notice, prepare for implantation of new rates, etc. The holidays are cutting into some of that time, so with apologies for reaching out during

various vacations, we have (hopefully only one) matter that we need to resolve, and hope to do so tomorrow.

It concerns the Commission's intention when it refers to use of "levelized" rates with respect to the credit or refund of the deferred taxes. The question is whether that means use of a flat rate (which Aqua assumes is the case) or of a percentage basis of calculation. We're asking the Commission if it can let us know what it meant tomorrow....or by Friday morning at the latest....so we can stay on track with preparation of notice.
