P1. <u>APPLICATIONS FOR CERTIFICATES OF PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY TO CONSTRUCT SOLAR FACILITIES</u>

EXPLANATION: The following applications seeking certificates of public convenience and necessity pursuant to G.S. 62-110.1 for construction of solar photovoltaic electric generating facilities were filed pursuant to Commission Rule R8-64.

Duke Energy Carolinas:

- <u>Docket No. SP-2665, Sub 51</u> Application filed on October 19, 2017, by Fresh Air Energy II, LLC, for a certificate to construct a 30-MW_{AC} facility in Stanly County, North Carolina
- <u>Docket No. SP-8431, Sub 0</u> Application filed on January 16, 2018, by Saw Solar, LLC, for an amended certificate to construct a 4.999-MW_{AC} facility in Rowan County, North Carolina (registration statement previously issued)

Duke Energy Progress:

 <u>Docket No. SP-2665, Sub 50</u> – Application filed on October 3, 2017, by Fresh Air Energy II, LLC, for a certificate to construct a 72-MW_{AC} facility in Robeson County, North Carolina

The Public Staff has reviewed the applications and determined that they comply with the requirements of G.S. 62-110.1 and Commission Rule R8-64.

Unless otherwise indicated above, the applicants also filed registration statements for new renewable energy facilities pursuant to Commission Rule R8-66(b). The registration statements included certified attestations that: (1) the facility is in substantial compliance with all federal and state laws, regulations, and rules for the protection of the environment and conservation of natural resources; (2) the facility will be operated as a new renewable

energy facility; (3) the applicant will not remarket or otherwise resell any renewable energy certificates sold to an electric power supplier to comply with G.S. 62-133.8; and (4) the applicant will consent to the auditing of books and records by the Public Staff insofar as those records relate to transactions with North Carolina electric power suppliers.

RECOMMENDATION: (Lawrence) That the Commission issue orders approving the applications, issuing the requested certificates, and accepting the registration statements for these facilities, as applicable. Proposed orders have been provided to the Commission Staff.

E. <u>WATER</u>

P1. <u>DOCKET NO. W-567, SUB 8 – PRIOR CONSTRUCTION COMPANY, INC. – APPLICATION FOR RATE INCREASE</u>

EXPLANATION: On March 15, 2018, Prior Construction Company, Inc. (Prior or Applicant) filed an application with the Commission seeking authority to increase its rates for water utility service in Deerfield Park, Paynes Park Landing, and Little John Acres Subdivisions in Wake County, North Carolina. Prior presently serves approximately 213 residential customers. The present rates have been in effect since January 1, 2017, when they were adjusted due to implementation of House Bill 998 (Session Law 2013-316), in Docket No. M-100, Sub 138, and Docket No. W-567, Sub 7. The last rates established in a general rate case were in Docket No. W-567, Sub 6, on February 12, 2007.

The Commission is of the opinion that the application constitutes a general rate case, that the proposed new rates should be suspended pending investigation, and that

the matter should be scheduled for customer hearing, subject to cancellation if no significant protests are received subsequent to customer notice.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED as follows:

- 1. That this proceeding is declared a general rate case pursuant to G.S. 62-137.
- 2. That the proposed new rates are suspended for up to 270 days pursuant to G.S. 62-134.
- 3. That the test period is established as the 12-month period ended December 31, 2017.
- 4. That the application is scheduled for public hearing at 7:00 p.m., on Wednesday July 18, 2018, in Commission Hearing Room 2115, Dobbs Building, 430 North Salisbury Street, Raleigh, NC. <u>This hearing may be canceled if no significant protests are received subsequent to public notice on or before May 25, 2018.</u>
- 5. That an officer or representative of the Applicant is required to appear in person before the Commission at the time and place of the hearing to testify concerning any of the information contained in the application. If the Applicant desires to cross-examine any witnesses at the hearing, the Applicant shall be represented by legal counsel at this hearing.
- 6. That the Notice to Customers, attached as Appendix A, be mailed with sufficient postage or hand delivered by the Applicant to all customers affected by the proposed new rates; that the Notice to Customers be mailed or hand delivered no later than 30 days after the date of this Order; and that the Applicant submit to the Commission the attached Certificate of Service properly signed and notarized not later 45 days after the date of this Order.

Notice is given that Prior Construction Company, Inc., 957 Rand Road, Garner, North Carolina 27529, filed an application with the North Carolina Utilities Commission on March 15, 2018, for authority to increase rates for water utility service in Deerfield Park, Paynes Park Landing, and Little John Acres Subdivisions in Wake County, North Carolina, as follows:

The Commission may consider additional or alternative rate design proposals which were not included in the original application and may order increases or decreases in the rates which differ from those proposed by the Applicant. However, any rate structure considered will not generate more overall revenues than requested.

EFFECT OF RATES

The present water rate has been in effect since January 1, 2017. The last rates established in a general rate case were in Docket No. W-567, Sub 6, on February 12, 2007. The proposed rates would increase the average residential monthly water bill from \$21.73 to \$39.87, an 83.5% increase, based on an average monthly usage of 4,300 gallons.

PUBLIC HEARING

The Commission has scheduled the application for public hearing at 7:00 p.m., on Wednesday July 18, 2018, in Commission Hearing Room 2115, Dobbs Building, 430 North Salisbury Street, Raleigh, North Carolina. This hearing may be canceled and the matter decided on the filings if no significant protests are received from consumers on or before May 25, 2018. Correspondence concerning the proposed rate increase, service problems, or the public hearing should be directed to the Public Staff.

Persons desiring to intervene in the matter as formal parties of record should file a motion under North Carolina Utilities Commission Rules R1-6, R1-7, and R1-19 no later than June 8, 2018.
