ORDER RESCHEDULING PUBLIC WITNESS HEARING IN ASHEVILLE

BY THE PRESIDING COMMISSIONER: On December 6 and December 19, 2019, the Commission issued orders in the above-captioned proceeding scheduling hearings, establishing deadlines, and requiring public notice of the application of Duke Energy Progress, LLC (DEP or Company), to adjust its rates and charges applicable to electric service in North Carolina. Five public hearings were scheduled solely for the purpose of receiving the testimony of public witnesses, including a hearing in Asheville, North Carolina, on February 20, 2020. Due to inclement weather in the state on that date, the Asheville hearing had to be cancelled.

The Presiding Commissioner finds good cause to reschedule the hearing in Asheville for Thursday, March 12, 2020, and to require the Company to publish the attached Public Notice.

- 1. That the public witness hearing previously scheduled for February 20, 2020, in Asheville shall be rescheduled for Thursday, March 12, 2020, at 7:00 p.m., in the Buncombe County Courthouse, Courtroom 1A, 60 Court Plaza, Asheville, North Carolina, and shall be solely for the purpose of receiving the testimony of public witnesses in accordance with Commission Rule R1-21(g);
- 2. That DEP shall publish in newspapers having general coverage in its western North Carolina service area the Public Notice of Rescheduled Hearing on Rate Increase Application attached as Appendix A once at least seven days in advance of the rescheduled Asheville hearing. The Public Notice shall cover no less than one-fourth of a page; and

3. That the Company shall file no later than the date of the hearing an affidavit of publication and certificate of service showing that it provided notice as required herein.
