PUBLIC NOTICE

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the North Carolina Utilities Commission has rescheduled for Wednesday, June 24, 2020, at 7:00 p.m. at the Halifax County Historical Courthouse, Commissioner's Meeting Room, 10 North King Street, Halifax, North Carolina, the hearing to receive public witness testimony regarding the application of American Beech Solar LLC (Applicant) for a certificate of public convenience and necessity (CPCN) to construct an 110-MW solar photovoltaic facility in Halifax County, North Carolina, as described herein. Public witness testimony will be received in accordance with Commission Rule R1-21(g).

The hearing may resume in Raleigh at a later date solely for the purpose of receiving expert testimony from the parties in Commission Hearing Room 2115, Dobbs Building, 430 North Salisbury Street, Raleigh, North Carolina.

On January 28, 2020, the Applicant filed an application pursuant to G.S. 62-110.1 and Commission Rule R8-63 for a CPCN to construct a 110-MW solar photovoltaic (PV) electric generating facility in Halifax County, North Carolina. In support of the application for a CPCN, the Applicant filed the direct testimony of Whitney Rubin, as well as several exhibits. In summary, construction of the 110-MW solar PV facility is anticipated to begin in late 2021, with the expected commercial operation date being as early as the fourth quarter of 2022. The location of the proposed facility is on 23 parcels of land along portions of Thirteen Bridges Road, Sorietown Road, Old 125 Road, Bynum's Bridge Road, and Sand Pit Road in Halifax County, North Carolina. The northwest portion of the project is located along both sides of Thirteen Bridges Road near Sorietown Road and Old 125 Road. The northeast portion of the project is approximately 0.5 miles south of Thirteen Bridges Road. The mideast section of the project is along the intersection of Sand Pit Road and Bynum's Bridge Road, with the project on both sides of Sand Pit Road. The southeastern portion of the project is to the south of the intersection of Sand Pit Road and Bynum's Bridge Road. The southwest part of the project is the south of the intersection of Sand Pit Road and Old 125 Road. The facility will interconnect with the electric transmission system owned by Dominion Energy North Carolina. The expected service life of the facility is 20 or more years.

Additional information about the application for a CPCN may be obtained from the Office of the Chief Clerk, North Carolina Utilities Commission, Raleigh, North Carolina, where a copy of the application, exhibits and supporting testimony are available for review by the public, and on the Commission's website at www.ncuc.net.

The Public Staff is authorized by statute to represent consumers in proceedings before the Commission. Written statements to the Public Staff should include any information that the writers wish to be considered by the Public Staff in its investigation of the matter.
