BY THE CHAIR: On January 29, 2020, Duke Energy Progress, LLC, and Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC (collectively Duke), filed their analysis of direct benefits to the State of North Carolina from Duke's spending on remediation of coal combustion residuals (CCRs), in compliance with the Commission's Order Requesting Additional Information (Additional Information Order) issued on November 9, 2018, in the above-captioned dockets.

In addition, Duke included in its filing a motion requesting that the Commission consolidate the annual analysis required by the Additional Information Order into the Annual Report due on March 1, 2021, in Docket No. M-100, Sub 154, pursuant to Commission Rule R25-6. In support of its motion, Duke explained that the Annual Report required by Commission Rule R25-6 encompasses the information required by the Additional Information Order. As a result, Duke is presently required to file the CCR

spending information required by the Additional Information Order on January 31 each year, and the Annual Report that includes the same CCR spending information, plus other information, on March 31 each year. Duke opined that consolidating the CCR spending information into the Annual Report will result in administrative and economic efficiencies for Duke and the Commission.

Based on the foregoing and the record in these dockets, the Chair finds good cause to grant Duke's motion to allow Duke to consolidate the filing of the CCR spending information required by the Additional Information Order into Duke's Annual Report filed pursuant to Commission Rule R25-6 on March 31, 2021, and in future years.

IT IS, THEREFORE, SO ORDERED.
